# Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets Water Quality Division FY2020 Inspection and Enforcement Summary


The Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets (VAAFM) has developed a comprehensive approach to the regulation of farms in order to best protect Vermont's water resources. VAAFM's approach provides size-specific regulatory oversight of Vermont farms of all sizes subject to regulation under the Required Agricultural Practices (RAP) Rule, including Small Farm Operations (SFOs), Certified Small Farm Operations (CSFOs), Medium Farm Operations (MFOs), and Large Farm Operations (LFOs).

This factsheet summarizes data from the VAAFM Agricultural Water Quality Enforcement Program State Fiscal Year 2020 (FY20) Annual Report. In FY20, the Enforcement Program recorded 503 water quality compliance visits. #### **ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS AND ASSOCIATED MONETARY PENALTIES**

In FY20, VAAFM issued 124 enforcement actions for alleged violations on 106 farms. VAAFM additionally issued two enforcement actions to one custom manure applicator for violations of the RAPs. Of these enforcement actions, 25 were Notices of Violation (NOVs) with proposed associated monetary penalties totaling \$44,750.

VAAFM referred two cases to the Vermont Attorney General's Office (AGO) for review in FY20, and the AGO is working to obtain corrective action and monetary penalties.

A further 34 farms and one custom applicator were referred to the Agency of Natural Resources, Department of Environmental Conservation (ANR DEC) for alleged point source discharges of wastes to surface water. For information related to these referrals, please contact ANR DEC.
