## Reportable Infectious Diseases in Animals

Reportable: Any disease determined by the secretary by rule to be a reportable disease or contained in the following list:

### Poultry Diseases:

Avian Influenza  
Fowl Cholera  
Infectious laryngotracheitis  
Mycoplasma Gallisepticum  
Mycoplasma Synoviae  
Newcastle disease  
Psittacosis (Chlamydiosis)  
Salmonella – pullorum, typhimurium, other salmonellas

Any Vesicular Disease – Foot and mouth disease, swine vesicular disease, vesicular stomatitis, vesicular exanthema

### Reporting of Diseases

All accredited veterinarians and persons operating animal disease diagnostic laboratories shall immediately report the discovery of any domestic animal within this state which is infected with or has been exposed to a reportable disease. The report shall be made to the state veterinarian and shall specify the location and description of the animal, the disease involved and the name and address of the owner or person in possession of the animal.
