# **Updates:**

# Kim (DEC):

- Plants were up in June, not July. New infestation at Gander Bay, hand-pulling led to eradication. EWM infestation at Joe's Pond, early detection and rapid response in progress.
- Lost garage space; hiring a new person.
- Prioritizing campgrounds, administrative work, and timber sales, though funding is limited.

### **Bonnie (AOT):**

• Environmental staff received plant ID training. Planning future invasive plant management in projects, including addressing Tree of Heaven (TOH) in Colchester.

### Kathryn (PPQ):

- Trap takedown starting. No significant findings reported.
- Concern about spotted lanternfly (SLF) in Springfield, MA, and its potential spread via I-91.
- Market surveys for SITC program; confiscated dairy products and cow urine (religious ceremonial use).

## Grace (F&W):

- Collaborating with VCE to manage invasives on Lake Champlain's remnant sand dunes, with Rugosa rose overtaking the state-threatened beach pea.
- Managing cheatgrass and spotted knapweed; biocontrol might be an option.
- Working on state land planting guidelines, focusing on shifting from non-native plants to using ecotype seeds.

#### Caitlin (VLT):

• Nothing to report.

# Toby (NRCS):

- Working on brush management, covering 2-3k acres/year.
- Updating technical documents to comply with state and federal pesticide and wetland rules.

### **Steve (Marsh Billings Rockefeller NP):**

• Treated Japanese tree lilac, added to NH ROW permits. Collaborated with VYCC to treat invasives and conducted aquatic vegetation surveys.

# Noah (FPR):

- Working on early detection and rapid response (EDRR) for mile-a-minute and stiltgrass.
- Significant stiltgrass infestation found at Pond Woods WMA; monitoring and managing newly disturbed soil areas.
- Publicly facing the VTInvasives website, focused on terrestrial plant reports.

### **Discussion Points:**

## **Nursery Inspection Update (Ben):**

• 100 inspections completed with 7 stop-sale orders: 3 for Norway maple, 2 for burning bush, 1 for water hyacinth, and 1 for wineberry. Most violations were from Canadian imports.

# **Public Reports & Response:**

• Focus on designated plant pests and early detection of giant hogweed and pale swallowwort. Discussed iNaturalist reports and state survey tools for infestation tracking.

# Max (VAAFM):

- Developed outreach materials on new plant pests with Katie. Printed pamphlets and fact sheets for public awareness, distributed at farmer's markets.
- Working to ensure materials are posted online.

## Judy:

• Mile-a-minute weed monitoring ongoing. Found new plants on the western side of the original infestation site, with plans to delineate further.

## Steph (VAAFM):

- Noxious weed rule update in collaboration with AOT, focusing on disposal techniques and staging areas to prevent dispersal.
- Legal review and rulemaking process underway to streamline invasive species listing.

# **VAAFM Pesticide Rule Updates (Bethany and Dave):**

- Updating pesticide manuals and certification exams. Collaborating with UVM's Pesticide Safety Education Program.
- Amended pesticide rule (first update in 32 years). New provisions for ROW permits, ecommerce, and terrestrial invasive plant control permits.
- Emphasis on coordination between permittees and inspections, with a focus on ROW and invasive species control.

# Language in Invasive Ecology (Emi & Noah):

- Discussed shifting the narrative around invasive species to reduce exclusionary and xenophobic language.
- Proposal to change terms like "invasive" to "introduced," recognizing the human role in species spread.
- Emi highlighted the importance of inclusive language to foster collective action and reduce harm.

#### **Action Items:**

- 1. Kim to coordinate on aquatic invasive species management and explore potential expansion with state staff survey tools.
- 2. Noah and Emi to continue efforts on statewide volunteer coordination for invasive plant management.
- 3. Steph and Ben to update and distribute educational materials online.
- 4. Dave to consider simplifying ROW and terrestrial invasive permit processes.
- 5. Emi to lead continued language revision discussions within the group.
