
3. Soil Conservation Practice and Payment for Ecosystem Services Working Group, also mandated by Act 83 - the work of this working group and its subsequent report has been exemplary. Because of the complexity of this topic, they would like to continue to meet next year. While their total request (\$500,000) is beyond our means at this time, any amount dedicated to this work would be a sign of our commitment to their work, the future of agriculture, and a recognition that farmers are part of the climate change solution. It would also be an indication of the state's commitment which may help the working group leverage additional funds through grants. We are attaching a copy of their report as well.


Baseline Fiscal Shock, % of general fund
